Introducing our new 7th and 8th grade specials teachers!

One of the hallmarks of the Sager School curriculum is "specials"—unique courses featuring creative arts, STEM, and more. In the upper grades, students individualize their experience by electing topics based on their interests. **7th and 8th grade specials** recently received an upgrade: our oldest students can now choose to create and teach their own specials!

Student leaders are responsible for preparing lesson plans and providing introductory instruction for a six-week special under the support and guidance of a faculty specialist.

ECC students build wide-ranging skills through dance

To supplement the vibrant curriculum led by the ECC classroom teachers, our *yeladim* at the Ginsburg ECC are treated to weekly visits from our skilled Schechter specialists that also serve as Sager School faculty. **Rena Rozen, Dance & Movement Specialist**, meets with ECC students on Thursday mornings to teach lifelong skills that will carry the children throughout their academic and personal journeys.

"By learning basic dance steps, yoga poses, and locomotor movements, children build physical skills—including body awareness, balance, and flexibility —in addition to improving cognition through counting, rhythm, sequencing, and spatial awareness.

There are also tremendous, unexpected opportunities: children cultivate speech and language abilities while processing verbal directions, build social-emotional



skills during mindfulness activities, and absorb cultural lessons through Israeli dancing. I promote FUN while we dance and learn to music—it's a pleasure to see the children's smiling faces each week."

Inquire & Inspire with Principal Nanci Caplan



Before beginning her nine year stint at Schechter—first as Director of Student Services and now as 7th-8th Grade Sager School Principal—Nanci Caplan worked as a school counselor and case manager at Chicago Public Schools and New York City Public Schools. She is currently pursuing her doctorate in Jewish Education at Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS).

Q: You were a featured presenter at the recent ISACS Conference in Columbus, Ohio on the Sager School's innovative "Big Idea" program. How is this interdisciplinary project reshaping the standards for exemplary middle school curricula?

A: Now in its third year, the Big Idea provides our 7th and 8th graders with an opportunity to work with peers, teachers, and consultants to design month-long courses based on their personal interests, culminating in interactive capstone projects. The Big Idea is BIG because it is not being done anywhere else in the country, and meets the standards for exemplary education by the Association for Middle Level Education.

This program recognizes the power that student voice brings to the education conversation, puts students in the driver's seat of their own learning, and allows students and teachers to collaborate in unique ways that prioritize idea-sharing, creative vision, and co-learning. Our goal is to help our children wake up each day EXCITED to come to school—that is a BIG ask from an adolescent. It's our responsibility to help these young adults find passion in their education, in their Judaism, and in their community.
