The newly renovated art room was already a dream for Hallie Redman, Sager School art teacher. "The comfortable space is accessible for every K-8 and Keshet student," she said. "With natural light, ample storage for supplies, a double sink, and modern technology, the art room is a beautiful, happy place where kids get to come in every day with a smile on their face."

This week, installation was completed on a kiln, and Mrs. Redman said she is thrilled to now have the option to fire clay and integrate clay work into the curriculum.

"When I heard that a family generously donated a state-of-the-art kiln to the art department, I thought this was absolutely the most amazing thing," she added. "Clay work provides such a



different sensory opportunity for students. Hand-building 3D pieces with clay is a tactile artistic experience that allows creativity to soar, and this imaginative thinking spills over into other subjects."




